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
DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

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Pilsen is the fourth largest city in the Czech Republic. It is located in western Bohemia. It is an important industrial, commercial, cultural, and administrative centre.

The city was founded on the confluence of four rivers – the Uhlava, Uslava, Radbuza and the Mže – by the Czech King, Wenceslas II, in 1295. Situated on the crossroads of two important trade routes and close to Prague, Pilsen experienced an immediate rapid growth.

OUR GOAL



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MGR. LUKÁŠ DIRGA, PH.D.

main research interests lie in penitentiary sociology (the sociology of prison life), criminology, criminal justice, penal policy, and the sociology of deviance. He is particularly interested in the process of humanization of the Czech prison system, and the role of religion in the prison environment.

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Social work with children and families

The aim of the course is to introduce social work with children and families. Students will become acquainted with the system of social and legal protection of children in the Czech Republic, social services for families and children, and typical methods for social work with these target groups (case studies, task-oriented approaches, communication boxes, assessments of the situation of the child etc.). Students will become familiar with the historical context and current trends in this area of social work. Visits and discussions with social workers focusing on children and family will be part of the course.

Contact as a key feature of social work

The course focuses on one of the basic tools of social work contact. The aim is to make students familiar with the concept and essence of contact in social work, to show its specificity and help to reflect the specificity and limits of the relationship, its actors (social worker and client), and the importance of their context. More specifically, the course will focus on contact in low-threshold services. Emphasis will be placed on teaching through case histories drawing from social workers' experience. Important parts of the course include visits in lowthreshold services and involvement in their activities.

Research methods for social workers

The course focuses on understanding the basic principles of qualitative and quantitative methodology, as well as the principles of preparation and implementation of a research project. Students will learn to distinguish among different research approaches, and will use practical training to become familiar with basic research methods: questionnaire surveys and selected types of qualitative interviews.


THE ERASMUS STUDENT CLUB PILSEN

ORIENTATION WEEK

The Orientation week is always held one week before the semester starts. PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Pilsen has quite a good transportation network with buses, trams, and trolleybuses, running day and night. Public transport travel is very simple. The only thing to do is to purchase a ticket (via a vending machine or at newsagents' shops or tobacconists, etc.). The price of a basic ticket is 18 CZK. Another possibility is the purchase of transfer tickets directly in the vehicles of the Public Transport, by means of the electronic wallet of the Pilsen Ticket chip card, or by credit card or via SMS.



COST OF LIVING

It is estimated that students will require approximately 300 – 350EUR per month to cover accommodation, food, and additional costs. Basic food is relatively cheap, as is public transport and cinema & theatre tickets. Restaurant prices are reasonable (the price depends on the category and quality of the restaurant).

EDUROAM

Students and staff can use the WEBnet infrastructure to connect their business and personal mobile devices (laptops, tablets, ...) to the wireless network. This connection is provided within the Eduroam federation, allowing each user to connect in other member organizations, both in the Czech Republic and around the world. Each user can use his/her mobile device to connect to the Eduroam network, wired and wireless, at UWB, and all affiliated academic institutions.
